FLIPPING THE RADIO DIAL BROUGHT ME BACK TO THE FAITH.

Our Lord is a gentleman; He never imposes Himself on us even as He pursues our hearts throughout life. Sue Reichard of Sts. Simon and Jude parish in Plain City, a gentle woman herself, would agree with this. Over the years, as she wandered away from the Church, Jesus has called her gently, yet persistently. That is, until He swept Sue off her feet through the programming on St. Gabriel Catholic Radio.

I was just flipping stations and found AM 820.

It was a year ago that Sue accidentally stumbled onto AM 820 while driving and she hasn't stopped listening since. "I was driving, just flipping stations," she says. "I really started learning about our Faith on AM 820. It didn't take long for me to program the channel into my car radio."

At the time Sue found St. Gabriel Catholic Radio, she was attending Lutheran, Presbyterian, and United Methodist churches with her husband. Yet in today's world, it's no surprise

that Sue was born into a Catholic family! She explains, "I was baptized Catholic and introduced to the Catholic Church as a child. My parents and extended family were practicing Catholics."

An Aunt's prayer life makes a deep impression.

One of Sue's fondest memories is her Aunt Cele's devotion to the Holy Rosary. "I watched my Aunt pray the Rosary and was drawn into this devotion myself. She and my Grandmother Beau also practiced the Corporal Works of Mercy. They would prepare "care packages" and deliver them to the homes of people who had no visitors and to nursing homes. That made a deep impression on me.

"But for some reason, in the seventh or eighth grade of school," continues Sue, "I began to check out other churches. As a young woman, I got married outside of the Church, to a Presbyterian." That decision took Sue even farther away from practicing Catholicism.

Just what IS Catholicism?

Sue's serendipitous discovery of the teachings of the Catholic Faith on AM 820 led her to ask, "Just what is Catholicism?" The answers that she heard on the radio led her to enroll in an RCIA (Right of Christian Initiation) program at Sts. Simon and Jude Catholic parish in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Sue is already baptized, so at Easter this year, she'll receive Confirmation.

"Growing up, I couldn't connect with the catechism that was being taught in religion classes. As a young adult, I never understood why being Catholic was different from being United Methodist, Presbyterian, or any other Christian denomination. Through St. Gabriel Radio and RCIA, I started learning the Truth about the Eucharist and the beauty of the Faith. I realized that the Catholic Church is where I need to be! I didn't understand the Catholic catechism as a child. Now, as an adult, I'm doing this because I desire this understanding. RCIA for me is an invitation. God is inviting me to embrace Him!"

Sue smiles as she points out that four or five of her fellow RCIA candidates at Sts. Simon and Jude also are avid AM 820 listeners. In class, they compare notes about what they've heard on AM 820 programs. "All of the programs

are very educational and have pointed me back to the Church," Sue affirms. "Father Riccardo offers helpful insight into daily living. I love listening to Mother Angelica."



My son the atheist

Sue's experience is a wonderful example of how a parent's response to the call to Faith affects the whole family, even children who reject the Catholic Church. She describes her family's reaction to her faith journey as, "watchful and even supportive."

In Sue's family, neither of her two sons was raised Catholic. One son is a self-proclaimed atheist. Yet, it was this son who invited Sue to attend Christmas Eve Mass together! Sue feels that her sons are

watching with interest as her journey unfolds. "My son, the atheist, was raised in various Christian denominations but today he is really interested in Catholic Saints! He talks a lot about the Catholic Faith. And his girlfriend is Catholic!"

In fact, both sons have chosen Catholic girlfriends. "My second son's girlfriend gave me a beautiful Rosary for Christmas because she knows my devotion to praying the Rosary. My son asks me about it. He clearly sees that I feel called to pray, especially the Rosary. I try to start every day with prayer," relates Sue.

Sue feels that her sons are watching with interest as her journey unfolds.

Sue's husband is watching too. At arm's length, he's supportive.

Make more time to pray.

Sue's growing faith and prayer life also have an impact on her work in mortgage bank loan origination. As an Assistant Vice President, her workdays can be very demanding, complicated, and fulfilling.

"I love to help people find homes. On this faith journey into the Church with AM 820, I've learned that when I make more time to pray, I feel less stressed during the day. That calmness helps me relate in Charity to the people who depend on me in the stress of home buying."

During the fall of last year, Sue experienced a startling, sudden onset of a medical problem that landed her in the hospital for several weeks. More weeks of convalescence followed with a full recovery, by the grace of God. Her growing prayer life and faith were close companions on this odyssey. She highlights the comfort and grace she received in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

Thy will be done!


